Summer Equine Camp

If you are the parent of a horse-crazy child and are looking for a fun, educational experience for him or her, look no further.

Life Adventure Center of the Bluegrass offers 5 sessions of Equine Camp for summer 2010. Activities include horseback riding lessons, equine vocational training, character education, equine field trips, crafts, journal writing, and horse games. Your children will learn about horses while building self-confidence and interacting with peers in a safe, positive environment.

The 5-day, co-educational sessions meet from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. and are offered to children ages 10-15.

Junior Camp

One 3-day session and one 5-day session of Junior Camp is offered for children age 7-9, from 9 a.m. – 12 p.m. Junior Camp is tailored to meet the needs of young horse enthusiasts. Campers receive riding instruction and vocational lessons customized for their age group and experience level and also do fun crafts and games!

Activities

Riding Lessons – Campers receive daily hunt-seat riding instruction on our dependable school horses that are suited to a variety of different experience levels.

Equine Field Trips – Camp participants will take trips to various equine facilities throughout the Bluegrass Region.

Character Development – Campers will participate in a variety of hands-on activities designed to promote positive peer interactions, healthy decision making, self-esteem, and improved communication skills.

Equine Vocational Training – Camp participants will learn valuable horsemanship skills such as grooming, saddling and bridling, bandaging, bathing, tack cleaning, and taking equine vital signs.

Outdoor Adventures – Campers will have multiple opportunities to enjoy the outdoors on our 575-acre farm. Activities may include a nature hike, climbing wall, or field games.

Journal Writing – At the conclusion of each day, campers are given a written journal assignment to help them reflect and respond to the day's activities.
